Last October, the LUI Che Woo Prize 2018 was awarded to three laureates at the <u>Prize Presentation Ceremony</u> in Hong Kong. <u>Mr. Hans-Josef Fell</u> was awarded the Sustainability Prize for his efforts in promoting the global renewable energy movement; the <u>World Meteorological Organization</u> was awarded the Welfare Betterment Prize for its success in reducing the impact of natural disasters; and <u>Pratham Education Foundation</u> was awarded the Positive Energy Prize for improving quality of education and literacy attainment.
